**7th Senior Course on Defence Studies: International Senior Course in Applied
Strategy and Defence Diplomacy**

Athens, Greece

15 September 2022 – 09 December 2022

OVERVIEW

AIM OF THE COURSE

The preparation of students so they are able, in the performance of their duties as flag officers of their countries, to cope with the rapidly changing situations of the geostrategic environment and to become defence staff officers who stand out for their level of strategic thinking and critical analysis. The goals of the course are achieved by building (development – expansion) on existing knowledge of students, on subjects related to strategy, history, international relations, defence Diplomacy and countering terrorism.

DURATION: 13 weeks

FREQUENCY: 1 course per year

PARTICIPATION ESSENTIALS

- This course is suitable for officers (or other public services equivalent) who, at minimum, successfully graduated from a Joint War College or equivalent. Graduation from a National Defence College or equivalent is desirable. The course is open to all international partners.

- English language proficiency is necessary, at least at level 3333, IAW STANAG 6001 (Professional level for: listening/ speaking/ reading/ writing). No additional language training or translation will be provided throughout the course.

- Students must have basic level computer skills in the Microsoft Office package (mostly Word and Power Point).

- Research Methodology, Critical Thinking in Strategic Studies (RMCT 1-4) (2 days).
- Thucydidean Approach to Applied Strategy (TAAS 1-8) (1 1/2 weeks).
- Managing Maritime Security Threats (MMST)– Held at NATO Maritime Interdiction Operational Training Centre, Crete (1 week).
- Strategic Leadership (SL 1-5) (1 week).
- Applied International Relations & Foreign Policy (AIRFP 1-10) (2 weeks).
- Cultural Awareness-Negotiations and Defence Diplomacy (CANDD) (2 weeks).
- Regional Studies (RS 1-10) (2 weeks).

 - Block II. The Middle East and North Africa-South East Mediterranean (MENASEM) (RS 6-10)
- Introduction to Peace Support Operations – Held at Multinational Peace Support Operations Training Center, Kilkis (1 week).
- Countering the Changing Threat of International Terrorism (CIT 1-4) (3/4 weeks).
